Let's try knowing what goes behind the tree planting photos that flood the social media on the day of planting!




वन महोत्सव... The planting festival... Celebrate the nature by 'growing greens' and 'growing greener' in all possible ways!!!


They don't have space @home... Have space for them in your •

larger humanity!





**Protecting the protectors...** 






Co-existence is the key! If u encounter one in your house know that were always there. Just accept this and let them BE! We and our extended hands are ready to help!



We stand by the WORLDs' RANGERS... We stand by those who PROTECT our future!!! Do you?




We try to ensure that locals don't have to bear the burden of conservation which indirectly is the result of what man did in the course of 'development'...


Ultimately it is all about conservation of forests!

Monsoons bring wild delicacies... The only key is their non-destructive harvest!




Hope WE PEOPLE learn to coexist and keep the corridors free for this intelligent and majestic animal...


You just need the right attitude and abundance of to be a second of the formature!

Considering the huge pressure on land resources, protection is one most important thing for any plantation to establish! Resources, terrain and local conditions determine which method is adopted for fencing!



No big deal it might seem, however one of the most effective ways of saving forests from cutting down, specially the smaller girth trees.




In places where there are abundant climbers of Bauhinia, forest dependent communities benefit from these. Long term sustainable harvest is the only thing that matters! Training local Self Help Groups and providing marketing platforms is taken up.



Road kills is a common issue in areas where roads cross the wildlife habitats. This Wildlife Week (1st to 7th October) let's pledge to be more considerate and careful as we drive on the roads crossing wildlife habitats...



Encroachment removal on forest land is the real challenge which stems out of the constant scarcity of land resources. Debated widely from the typical pro-people, populist angles, there are few who support it from the perspective of the Forester. Might seem unpleasant to many but it's our duty and we are doing it!



Forests are open treasures, hundreds of hectares managed by a single forest guard. Illicit felling i.e. illegal felling of trees for different purposes like timber, fuel, products like catechu, sandal wood, gums and resins and for clearing of land is usual offence seen in the forests. We try our best to restrict it, and still if it takes place we do everything what a policeman does!

## THE LESSER KNOWN KHAKI #49

GRASS LANDS are the most neglected and least considered ECOSYSTEMS. On the contrary they are the one ensuring fodder and water security in our country. MEADOW DEVELOPEMENT is priority week in tiger reserves to exect resources to increase preybase. But it is equally important for the other areas where cattle graze freely.



Grasslands... They are lifelines for many many herbivores and domestic cattle both within and outside the forests. Never taken very seriously, they are either over grazed, converted to agricultural lands or woody plantations! We practice meadow development and management in some wild-life rich areas for the reason. But there's still much much more to it!



Talk of the time... We are those who actually work with these huge beings who can be both net emitter or net absorber of Carbon! It all depends on what management principles we follow...

These were some of the activities carried out during monsoons along with routine works carried out by the foresters... Since most of the works are seasonal, more to come!
